## Solution to LOST AT SEA:

This column is another in our ongoing series. For additional instructions, refer to one of our past columns. (An archive is available on our website.) You do not need to look at the wedge below to solve the puzzle.


Cryptic crossword clues are split into two parts: a definition of the answer you're looking for, and another way to construct the answer through wordplay. These parts can come in either order. Some examples of cryptic constructions:

- Anagram: A clue may be the anagrammed letters of the answer; this is hinted with words like "wild" or "drunk." Ex: "Tarnation!" snarled Pulp Fiction director." The answer TARANTINO ("Pulp Fiction director") comes from the snarled letters of "Tarnation."
- Charades: Some cryptic answers can be broken into smaller words, clued individually. Ex: "Friend follows child completely." ALLY ("friend") follows TOT ("child") to make the answer TOTALLY ("completely").
- Hidden Answers: Sometimes the entire answer appears intact, but camouflaged. Ex: "Myopic colonel clutches flute." Here, "myoPIC COLOnel" holds, or "clutches," PICCOLO ("flute"). Alternatively, in "Premiers of state hang out with guide," the answer SHOW ("guide") is hidden in the "premiers of" State, Hang, Out, With.
- Double Definitions: Some clues have two definition halves. MOPED could be clued: "Motorbike was blue."
