## Solution to FRANKENWORDS:

Combine one of the words clued by the left column with one of the words clued by the right column to form a portmanteau. Each portmanteau has a unique length and fits into one of the set of blanks below the clues. The words and portmanteaus are:

| INFORMATION | + COMMERC | CIAL |
| :---: | :---: | :---: |
| COSTUME | + PLAY | $=$ COSPLAY |
| SPANISH | + ENGLISH | = SPANGLISH |
| SMOKE | + FOG | = SMOG |
| BREAKFAST | + LUNCH | = BRUNCH |
| STAY | + VACATION | = STAYCATION |
| PLASTIC | + LEATHER | = PLEATHER |
| LION | + TIGER | = LIGER |

Reading the boxed (bold) letters top to bottom gives the answer MANSCAPE. Congratulations to Sean Kern, Keita, and Aaron Szasz who were the first three to submit the correct answer to last week's puzzle on our website (http://puzzle.berkeley.edu).

## THE MIGHTY DUCKLINGS

Oh no! The baby ducklings are lost! Luckily, they have learned from their mama a surefire way to get home.

1. Adjacent letters are the 5 letters that are to your immediate left, right, straight ahead, and forward diagonals. All directions are given relative to a duckling walking on the board and not from a bird's-eye view. If two rules conflict, defer to the earlier rule.
2. If the three letters in front of you spell a word (reading from left to right), write down the letter you're standing on and turn left. Ducklings are still young so they only recognize words that would be in a children's dictionary.
3. If you see a $\mathrm{Q}, \mathrm{X}$, or Z directly in front of you, PANIC! Turn back the way you came and step forward three letters without looking at any adjacent letters along the way.
4. If the letter you are standing on and a letter adjacent is both a state abbreviation and an element, ignore that pair.
5. If the letter you are standing on followed by a letter adjacent spells a US state abbreviation, turn toward that adjacent letter and step forward the number of vowels in the state's name without looking at any adjacent letters along the way.
6. If the letter you are standing on followed by a letter adjacent spells an element abbreviation, turn toward that adjacent letter and step forward onto it. If there are two, pick the one with larger atomic number.
7. If you don't know what to do, always turn right ( 90 deg ) and step forward.
