### Solution to Family Schedule:

The flavor text suggests that you are looking at a calendar and need to start crossing things off. A search on the letters in each grid box should show that they are abbreviations for the names of months in multiple languages. Only 1 month from each language appears in each grid. Those months also appear in order and form a 3-month triplet. The ordering from start to finish is consistent between the grids. To make it easier to uniquely identify the months, no two months from the same triple occupy the same column.

Once you crossed off all of the triplets, you are left with a single box in each grid TRI, MES and TER which gives the answer TRIMESTER.
