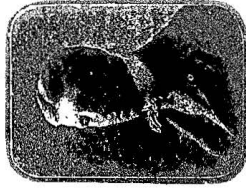

CALIFORNIA WINS ANNUAL DEBATE.

UNANIMOUS DECISION OF COMMITTEE.

Victory Gives California the Hastings Hearst Trophy Cup.

The Tenth annual Intercollegiate debate between California and Stanford was won on Saturday night by California. Notwithstanding the nearness of examinations, a large audience nearly filled Metropolitan Temple, San Francisco.

The question for debate was: "Resolved: That the United States should grant the suffrage to the Negro in accordance with the spirit of the Fifteenth Amendment; provided, that all questions of the constitutionality of the negative position be excluded."

The affirmative side of the question, upheld by California, was presented by Max Pfeiffer, '24, Walter Rothchild, (Law) '24, and Ralph S. Pierce, '24. Stanford supported the negative, and was represented by Herbert C. Jones, '22, George W. Leister, '24, and Frederick B. Wagner, '22, the winner of the debate.

President Jordan of Stanford presided, and Superior Judges M. C. Stone and F. B. Mervazy, and Supreme Judge R. C. Richardson, as judges of the debate.

Max Pfeiffer of California opened the debate for the affirmative, placed the burden of proof on the negative, and acted as the affirmative side, and acted as the affirmative side, and acted as the affirmative side.

The spirit of the Fifteenth Amendment, its essence, real meaning, or intent, was simply non-discrimination, simply that the Negro should not be discriminated against in any way.

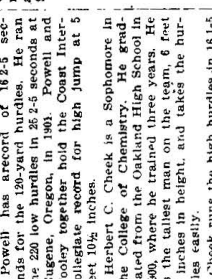
