The best athletes that the University of California has been able to produce will leave Berkeley next Thursday morning for the East to compete with the brawn and muscle of the Eastern colleges. We feel that this is a good step in the right direction for many reasons. It is well that California's athletes should keep in touch with the best methods of the East. The sending of such a team East is the best kind of an advertisement for the University of California and for the State of California. We are glad to have such a band of men to send, men who are strong athletes and true gentlemen. The team will leave next Thursday whether the desired sum of \$3900 is raised or not. If this amount is not raised immediately so that the full number of men may go the team will be at a disadvantage, or if the full number of men are taken they will be hampered financially. championship field day this year. Hussey is a Senior in the College of Chemistry. He is 5 feet 9 3/4 inches in



height. He began his career as an athlete in the Oakland High school, where he competed in the broad jump and 100-yard dash. Mr. Hussey is a member of the Kappa Alpha Fraternity, and is also a member of the Skull and Keys, and Golden Bear Honor Society.

In the sprints, Cadogan, '03, and Abadie, '04, will be placed on an equality with Eastern men. 0:10 flat in the 100-yard dash is the best that has been made in the East this year, and both are capable of this.

Anthony G. Cadogan is a Junior in the College of Mining; he is 5 feet 8 1/2 inches in height. His first work in athletics was done in the Oakland High School, where he ran the 220 and 440.

Since entering the University he has made the record of 10 seconds flat in the 100-yard dash, a feat which he accomplished three times last year. He also made the 220-yard dash in 22 2/5 seconds, which is a college record. In the meet with the University of Oregon last year Cadogan made the 220 in 22 seconds flat, but on some technical-



Powell has record of 16 2/5 seconds for the 120-yard hurdles. He ran the 220 low hurdles in 25 2/5 seconds at Eugene, Oregon, in 1901. Powell and Cooley together hold the Coast Intercollegiate record for high jump at 5 feet 10 1/2 inches.

Herbert C. Cheek is a Sophomore in the College of Chemistry. He graduated from the Oakland High School in 1900, where he trained three years. He is the tallest man on the team, 6 feet 4 inches in height, and takes a hurdle easily.

Cheek runs the high hurdles in 16 1/5 seconds and the low hurdles close to 26 seconds. He broad jumps 21 feet 5 inches and high jumps 5 feet 9 inches. He is a member of the Delta Upsilon Fraternity.

Roy R. Service, who is a Senior in



the College of Natural Sciences, is one of the best men on the California team. He is 5 feet 9 inches in height. Accompanying the track team on their Eastern trip in 1900, he made a splendid showing, and has improved his running in every way since that time.

Decoto Urges Necessity of More Money for Trip.

Now that the team is on the eve of departure it might be well to make a conservative estimate of its chances at the meet on the Berkeley Oval. Let us start first with Flaw. He is sure of five points with the hammer, and give him third with 2 points in the shot, although I believe he is at least a sure second. In the 100 and 220 with Cadogan and Abadie we should be able to get at least 4 points. This would mean a third and fourth in the 100 and fourth in the 220. In the half Service can certainly come second, 3

more points, and the chances are he may come first. In the mile Redwell with a little effort can come third, 2 more points, and in the two-mile Tibbits should come fourth. In the broad jump, I think we should come second, giving us 3 points. In the hurdles Cheek and Powell should be able to take at least 3 points, say a third in the 220, and fourth in the 120. This would give us a total of 24 points. It seems to me that everything in this estimate promises to be better and not to be worse. I think that is a statement evident to those who have followed track work.

We have ten men who are certainly fit to compete with any in the East, but there is one thing necessary to making their work yield the highest results. This one thing is good care and careful handling. Christie can be trusted to use good judgment in handling the men, but the only way we can insure proper care of the boys is by seeing that they are given the best of accommodations in traveling, the best food at all times, and comfortable and roomy quarters. Two years ago twelve men made the same trip for \$3000, but I cannot say that at all times they had
